

NHULUNBUY MASTER PLAN AND FEASIBILITY STUDY RECREATION FACILITIES AND OPEN SPACE

PROJECT OVERVIEW

The Nhulunbuy community has changing recreation needs and aspirations. The Nhulunbuy Corporation strives to meet these needs through strategically planning for recreation facilities and open spaces over the next ten years.

The purpose of this project is to better understand the current and likely future recreation needs of the community and develop a framework for the effective provision, management and development of recreation facilities, open spaces and services.

The master plan and feasibility study will address the following:

- ▶ Recreation facilities managed by the Nhulunbuy Corporation
- ▶ Recreation facilities managed by other organisations
- ▶ Open space areas
- ▶ Surrounding water areas
- ▶ Cultural heritage facilities, programs and services
- ▶ Revitalisation of the Town Centre

- ▶ Stage 2: Feasibility Study development
- ▶ Stage 3: Master Plan development
- ▶ Stage 4: Final Report

PROJECT OUTCOMES

The final study will position Nhulunbuy as the regional hub for East Arnhem Land and provide a ten-year vision and action plan for recreation and open spaces, which will specifically address:

- ▶ current and future sporting and recreation needs
- ▶ usage strategies and strategic master planning for open spaces and recreation reserves
- ▶ the role of the Nhulunbuy Corporation and other stakeholders
- ▶ suitable models for capital contributions from community groups towards facility improvements
- ▶ tenancy models that reflect equitable maintenance responsibilities and cost recovery principles
- ▶ the need for flexibility and adaptability to changing demographics and community needs
